
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Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum






At Carlisle school we place a high emphasis on the importance of the children being happy and settled.



This also applies to reapplication for your child's junior school place when your child begins in Year 2

If you do not live within the borough you need to apply for a place through your own council and you can include Richmond schools in your application.

Admissions Criterion:

1. SEN* Place reserved for a child with an Education, Health and Care Plan
2. Looked after child (including previously looked after children)
3. Exceptional family, social or medical need
4. Having a brother or sister in the school or the paired school
5. Children of staff
6. Distance of home address to school

The closing date for applications is

15th January 2022.
