Cool Milk—Reception Children-

IMPORTANT INFO

Please remember that all children under the age of 5 will receive free Government funded milk. **When your child turns 5, or if they are already over the age of 5, you have the option to pay for their milk directly through Cool Milk.**

If you would like your child to receive milk, then please visit www.coolmilk.com and select “register your child for milk here” then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay.

Please be aware the cut off date is Tuesday for milk orders to commence the following week.

All parent/carers must contact cool milk if they have any problems.



School Meals/Pack Lunches

Please remember **you must give one week's notice (from a Monday)** for your child to change from school meals to pack lunches or vice versa. This is due to kitchen staff needing to know what to order for the following week. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

Please ensure your child comes to school in their PE kit which consists of black shorts/ black jogging bottoms/school PE t shirt and trainers.

Notices/Reminders

School Absence-Important Procedures

Please note that any requests for absence (holiday) must be submitted on a **'Request to authorise absence from school form'**, a copy of which can be found on the school website. Please complete when necessary and **pop in the post box outside the school office.**

Term dates are attached available on the school website.

Please could all parent/carers ensure they let the office know each day if their child is unwell and the nature of the illness. Medical evidence may be required for absences longer than 5 days and when attendance falls below 90%. Please note that on their return to school you must confirm in writing the reason for their absence. This letter is kept on file for the Education Welfare Officer who monitors all school attendance.

Please also provide written proof of any appointments and advise whether your child will be requiring a school meal.

May we also remind you that if your child has vomiting or diarrhoea, you must wait 48 hours from the last episode before bringing your child back to school.

As per recent letter it imperative that all parent/carers respect this rule as we currently have a child under going chemotherapy who is immune-compromised.

School Post box!

Please note that **all** post, forms/permission slips etc are put into the post box at the front of the school. Please make sure that any payments are in an envelope with your child's name, class and contents written on the front of the envelope. Thank you for your cooperation.



HHJS News

This is an important reminder to Carlisle parents picking up children from HHJS:

Please remember that we do not allow scooters in the playground at 3.30pm and there is **NO ENTRY** to the adventure playground. **Please make sure your children respect these rules.** Thank you

NAMING CLOTHES-URGENT PLEA!

There are a number of items of uniform being found around the school which are **un named**, especially in Year Reception. Please note any items found without a name will be put straight into the yellow wheelie bin at the front of the school.

It is vital that all your child's belongings are named, including PE kits, shoes and water bottles. Any items which are found and named will be sent down to your child's classroom.

Please can you ensure that your child brings everything with them when they leave school and clubs.

Notices/Reminders

Safeguarding:

Please can we remind parents and carers that any change of arrangement regarding the picking up of children at the end of the day must come from the parent or carer and be communicated to the School Office.

We cannot accept changes of arrangement that come to us via a third party.

Please could after school clubs also be informed if there is a change of arrangement which means that children will not be on their register for that day. Thank you for your cooperation.

Communication-Parent Hub App

Please remember to use Parenthub, our communications system app, launched earlier this year.

The flyer on how to access parenthub is included in this newsletter but it is as simple as downloading the app, creating your account and adding us as your school.

You do of course need a smartphone to access the app but the benefit for the school is that all communications to parents on the app is FREE!! So we would encourage everyone to support us and use the app

Any parents who are unable to access it should contact the office.

We are aware of some parents who have been experiencing problems with the App and have been sent this advice from Parent Hub. Please follow the instructions below which should resolve any problems.

1. Check that the parent is on the latest version of the app (3.1.5 as of 21/09/18, increasing to 3.1.6 in the coming days). I recommend deleting the app and reinstalling it, or you can go into the phone's app store, search for Parent Hub, and check from there. If the parent is not on the latest version, there'll be an option to 'Update'.

2. Clear the app session. This allows the app to restart from fresh. On iPhones, this is done by double tapping the Home button on the phone, and swiping upwards on the app screen. For Android phones, tap the left side 'recent apps' button, followed by the 'X' icon in the top right of the app screen.

Make sure the parent's phone has a good wifi or mobile data connection. Without being connected to the internet, parents won't be able to sign in, and the app won't be able to retrieve and display any new messages sent by the school.

If the parent is unable to sign in, check that their email address is correct. If the parent already has an account, and has previously been following your school, they will be listed in the 'On the app' section in the Parent Hub school portal (Dashboard > Contacts > On the app). If you search for them, and then click on their name, a new webpage will open that displays their account details. I advise checking the email address used for their Parent Hub account against the one that's being used to try to sign in.

Message From Turing House School re Planning Application For New Site

This message has been sent to us From Colin Mackinlay, Headteacher of Turing House School. Please read and follow the link if you would like to support.

Dear Parents,

Happy New Year! If you haven't got round to it yet, please take a few moments now to support the school's planning application for our permanent building, and encourage your partners and friends to do the same. Here is the link: http://www2.richmond.gov.uk/PlanData2/Planning_CaseNo.aspx?strCASENO=18/3561/FUL.

It's really important that we show local decision makers that the plans are well supported by parents, especially as there is a small, but vocal campaign group working hard to persuade councillors that the plans should be rejected. Over Christmas they delivered 10,000 leaflets encouraging people to object, and have been making a lot of false claims about the plans online. The number of objections was also boosted by a mailshot from an environmental group which objects to all development on Metropolitan Open Land. As a result, many of the objections are from outside of the local area.

None of this negativity affects the technical strength of the planning case, and campaigns against school building projects are very common. However, to keep the path through the process smooth, the Planning Committee need to see that the proposal is well supported by parents.

Many of you have done this already we know but there are still a great number more of you who could do so too. It's not that many clicks on your phone screen so please do respond now! It's one New Year's resolution that won't take too much effort to complete!

There is no need to write an essay - it is enough to say you support the plans - but if you would like to write more detail and need guidance, please refer to the email sent to you by the school on December 18th (let us know if you need a copy).

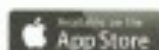
