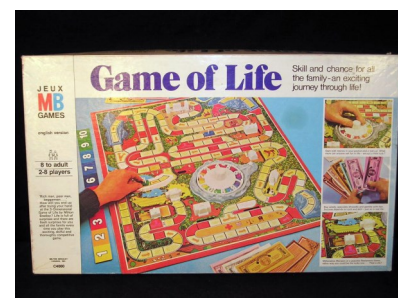
Staff Car Park
