


Carlisle Infant School News from Carlisle 8th February 2024





Message From Ms Brittain-Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to let you know that we have been awarded the Silver Rights Aware School Award by UNICEF UK, who spoke highly of our articulate children and how impressed they were with the work being done to ensure our pupils grow up keen to make a difference to the world they live in. Huge thanks to Mrs Coombes and our UNICEF buddies who lead this work in school.

This half-term has been filled with opportunities for the children to consolidate their knowledge and understanding and develop a passion for learning. Over the past couple of weeks Year 1 have been visited by Mr Soin from the Gurdwara, and enjoyed a fabulous space day. Reception pupils boarded a Route master bus from the 1950s and Year 2 have created amazing dragon's eyes with clay and thoroughly enjoyed Chinese noodles.

As you are aware attendance and punctuality are extremely important and give your child the best possible start in life. The aim should be to attend

100% of the time. Pupils who miss school frequently can fall behind in their learning and often need extra support to catch up with their peers. Developing good attendance and punctuality will support these habits for life.

If a child has 95% attendance, this still equates to nearly two weeks absence in a year. If a child has 90% attendance, this equates to nearly four weeks absence in a year. If a child has 85% attendance, this equates to nearly six weeks absence in a year.

With four of my own children, I completely understand children become ill and there are times when they are too unwell for school. However when they are well enough to attend, please ensure they are in school. If your child's attendance drops below 90% we are not able to authorise absences without medical evidence. Please support us with this by informing the school office by phone call or email when they are absent.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to the CSA and all families who support their events. Additional surfacing is currently being added to our play areas to allow children greater access in all weathers and replacement fencing is being installed where fencing is in need of repair.

I wish you all a happy half-term.


Parking!

As I am sure that you are aware, there is a current spike in measles in the UK, with a number of cases confirmed in London.

The MMR/Polio team are running a series of clinics in our boroughs to vaccinate all school age children who are missing one, or both doses of the MMR vaccine. The information for




Is your child fully protected?

Your child needs two doses of the MMR vaccine to be fully vaccinated against measles, mumps and rubella.

School Absence-Important Procedures

Please note, your child's absence <u>must be reported every day.</u> Unless it is vomiting/diarrhoea and we have already been informed, or an illness where we know they will be off for a number of days. Please call the school office at anytime on 0208 979-2770 and press option 1 and leave a message. We appreciate your cooperation which will save the office staff having to run around the school to see whether your child is in or not!



Medical evidence will be required for absences longer than 5 days and when attendance falls below 90%.

Please also provide written proof of any appointments and advise whether your child will be requiring a school meal.

May we also remind you that if your child has vomiting and/or diarrhoea, you must wait 48 hours from the last episode before bringing your child back to school.
